They take their name from Giltspur Street, which leads up to the entrance of the church where they rehearse: St Bartholomew-the-Less, inside the grounds of St Bartholomew's Hospital in the City of London. The choir performs mainly in and around London. Repertoire ranges from medieval music to contemporary pieces and the choir sings in several languages, among them Latin, French, German and early forms of English. The members of the choir are professionals in a wide range of careers, including the law, finance, education, journalism, retail, the entertainment industry, P.R. and I.T. Some are music graduates but, for the majority, music has always been a hobby: a source of recreation and enjoyment that the Giltspur Singers hope to share in their performances.
