Antonia Mott

... was a Junior Exhibitioner in the Junior Department of the Royal College of Music where she studied with the late Angela Fussell, winning the Sally Wainwright Woodwind Prize and the Marjorie Humby Prize for Solo Performance. She reached the final stages of the Audi Junior Musician of the Year and BBC Young Musician of the Year Competitions; and she was principal clarinettist of the Essex Youth Orchestra and a member of the National Youth Wind Orchestra. In 1997 Antonia was awarded a place at the Royal College of Music, studying clarinet with Colin Bradbury and Janet Hilton. She was awarded prizes for contemporary music performance, and the coveted Douglas Whittaker Chamber Music Prize in two consecutive years. She has performed at venues that include the Wigmore Hall, Queen Elizabeth Hall, Royal Albert Hall, National Gallery, St. Martin in the Fields and, by royal invitation, Kensington Palace and Buckingham Palace. Antonia is currently principal clarinettist with Orchestra of the City and first clarinet in the British Clarinet Ensemble.

Dr Christopher Maxim

... is founder-conductor of the Giltspur Singers and also directs the St Teilo Singers. His compositions are published by (among others) Banks, the Royal School of Church Music and Stainer & Bell; and many are available on the Score Exchange website. USA-based Paraclete will soon be publishing a number of his organ and choral pieces. Chris has been Organist & Director of Music at St Matthew's, Bethnal Green, since January 2003.
